CHECK ADMISSIONS POLICY TERMS & CONDITIONS TO ENSURE PARENTS ARE AWARE OF THE DOCUMENTATION THAT MAY NEED TO BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO ACCESSING THE SETTING

Setting Management must adhere to the Data Protection Act (2006) and ensure confidentiality at all times

Parents register an interest at the Early Years (EY) provision and the child's physical/medical needs are discussed. Parents are advised of the process that will follow:

- Provision to provide admissions policy.
- Remind parents of disclosure.
- Reinforce parental responsibility to share key information about their child.

EY provision arranges a meeting with parents/carers and all relevant professionals involved in the child's care.

- Assess all available information that is given and identify any gaps.
- An action plan should be put together.
- For identified gaps in information; request written information from medical professionals with parents/carers consent confirming the child's diagnosis; relevant symptoms; and the procedures to be followed in the event of an emergency.
- Arrange another meeting if necessary to review any additional or new information.

EY provision consults Insurance provider regarding medical needs of child/cover available.

(HCP) is for ALL children with a medical condition where medication must be administered at the provision or where there may be the possibility of a medical emergency.

A Health Care Plan

An **Individualised Risk Assessment** is to identify potential risks of injury that may occur when in the care of the provider in a given situation.

A Personal Emergency Evacuation Plan (PEEP) is for children who require something different to or in addition to any other child in the event of an evacuation.

All practitioners working directly with and around the child have received a good understanding of the child's needs and the content of all documentation.

Visitors or agency practitioners are made aware of child's needs if appropriate.

- Child's physical/medical need changes.
 (only on receipt of information from a medical professional)
- Practitioners change.
- Additional training is required.
- Significant changes made within the environment.
