#### **ADOPTION STATEMENT**

#### **PLANNING FOR HEALTH SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT 2013**

This adoption statement has been prepared in accordance with Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004 as amended by the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2012, and gives notice that Dudley Council adopted the Planning for Health Supplementary Planning Document (hereinafter referred to as "SPD") on 18<sup>th</sup> September 2013.

#### **Subject Matter**

The SPD sets out how health and health inequalities can be positively impacted upon by good planning, and gives detailed guidance on ensuring that the health implications of any new development are considered at the earliest possible stage. It is intended to inform the planning process; to provide a guide for developers, applicants and land owners, and will be taken into account in making planning decisions for the Borough. The SPD has been prepared taking account of evidence gathered through public consultation and representations received from interested parties and stakeholders.

#### **Area of Document**

The SPD applies to the entire Dudley Metropolitan Borough i.e. the administrative area of Dudley Metropolitan Borough Council.

Any person aggrieved by the SPD may make an application under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 to the High Court on the grounds that:

- A) the document is not within the appropriate power;
- B) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

Any such application must be made no later than 3 months from the date of adoption of this SPD.
