

Population

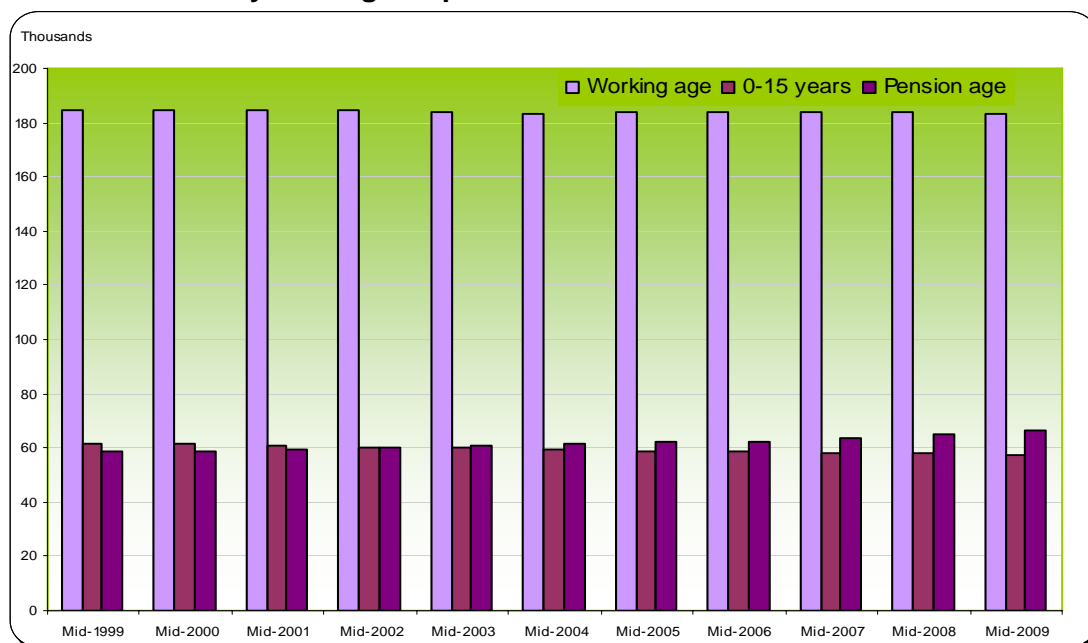
- In mid-2009, Dudley Borough had an estimated population of 306,600 people, making it the 6th largest local authority in the West Midlands region and 25th largest in England. Between mid 1999 and mid 2009, the Borough had an overall rising population of 1,700 people, experiencing an increase in 6 out of the 10 years.
- Over the same period, the working age population decreased by 1,500 people, decreasing in 7 out of the 10 years. In 2009, Dudley Borough's working age population was 183,300 people; equating to 60% of the total population of the Borough.
- Dudley Borough has a larger proportion of Pension Age people (66,100) than the WM region and a smaller proportion of those aged 0-15. 19% of the Borough's population is aged between 0-15 years whilst 22% are of pension age. 50.8% of the Borough's population are male.

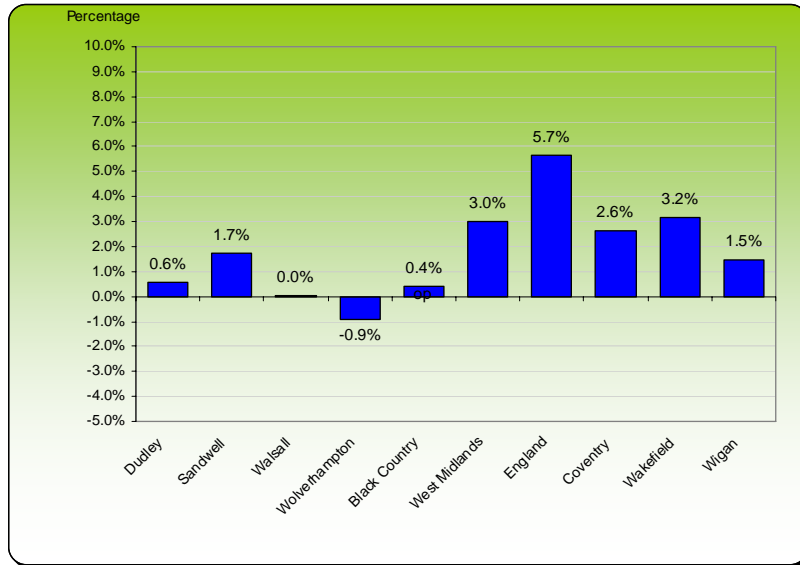
Dudley Borough Population - Mid 1999 to Mid 2009

- Between 1999 and 2009, Dudley Borough's total population increased by 0.6%; higher than the Black Country average of 0.4% but lower than the West Midlands which increased by 3% and England which increased by 5.7% over the same period.

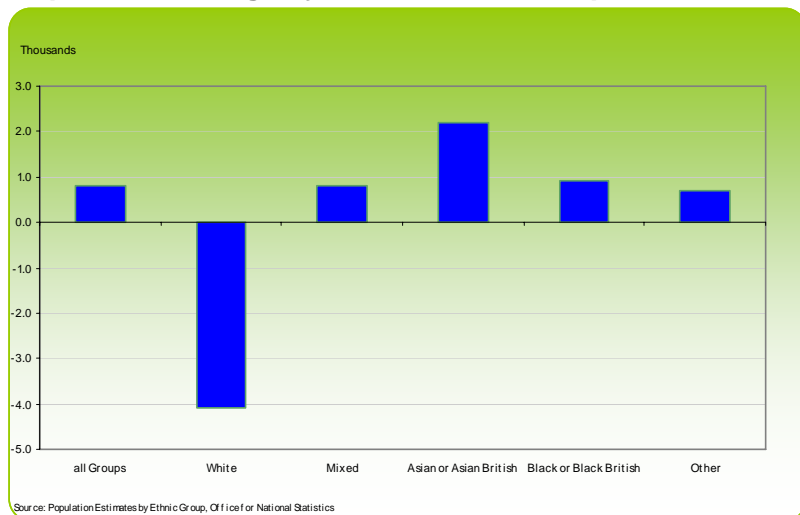
Ethnicity of the Borough's population

- The latest population estimates by ethnicity are for 2007. 91.3% of Dudley Borough residents are white compared with 86.1% for the WM region. The greatest proportion of non-white people in the Borough are Asian or Asian British (5%) compared with 8.4% for the region.

Population Change by Broad Ethnic Group - 2003 to 2007

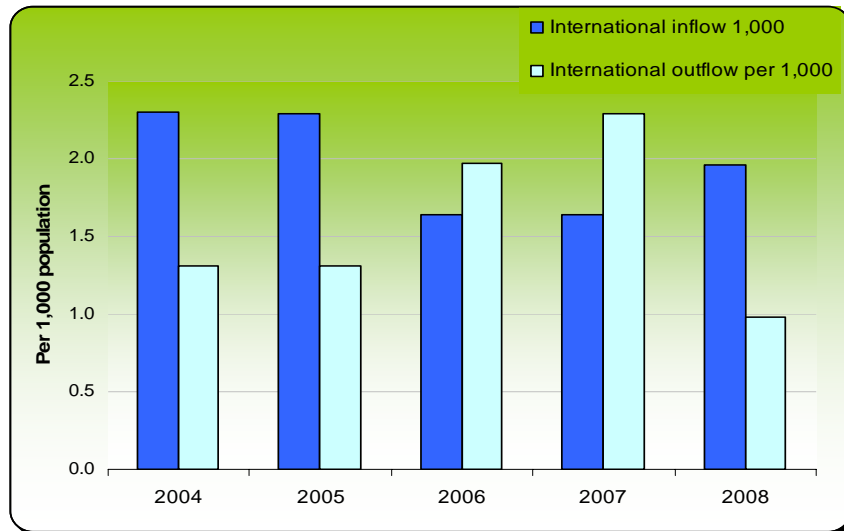

Migration

- During 2004 and 2005, international in-migration exceeded out-migration in the Borough; this could be mainly attributed to the A8¹ Central and European countries joining the European Union. In 2004, international in-migration into the Borough was 2.3 per 1,000 resident population, whilst out-migration was 1.3 per 1,000 resident population. Migration in and out of the Borough was slightly less in 2008 than in 2004 with an in-migration rate of 2.0 per 1,000 resident population and out-migration at 1.0 per 1,000 resident.

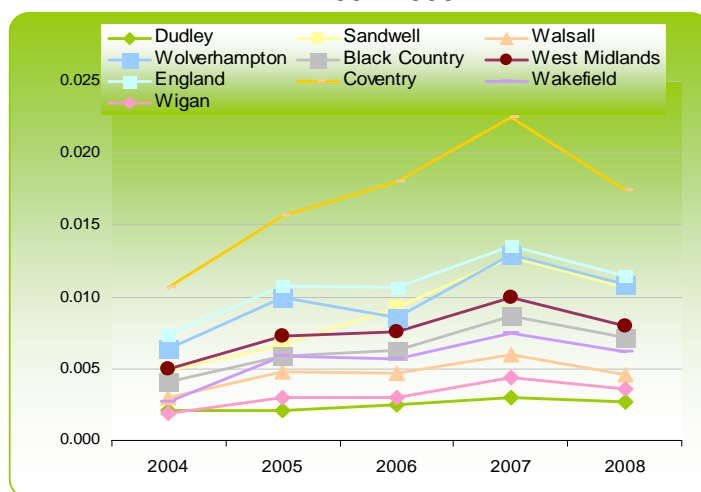
Dudley Borough - International Inflow and Outflow - 2004-2008

- Migrant National Insurance Number (NINo) registration data provides a means of monitoring in-migration. A NINo is required by any overseas national looking to work or claim benefits in the UK. The number of NINo registrations increased gradually from 640 in 2004 to 910 in 2007 before decreasing to 810 in 2008. In 2008, the rate of NINo registrations was equivalent to 0.3% of the resident population, significantly lower than the rate for the Black Country (0.7%), West Midlands (0.8%) and England (1.1%).

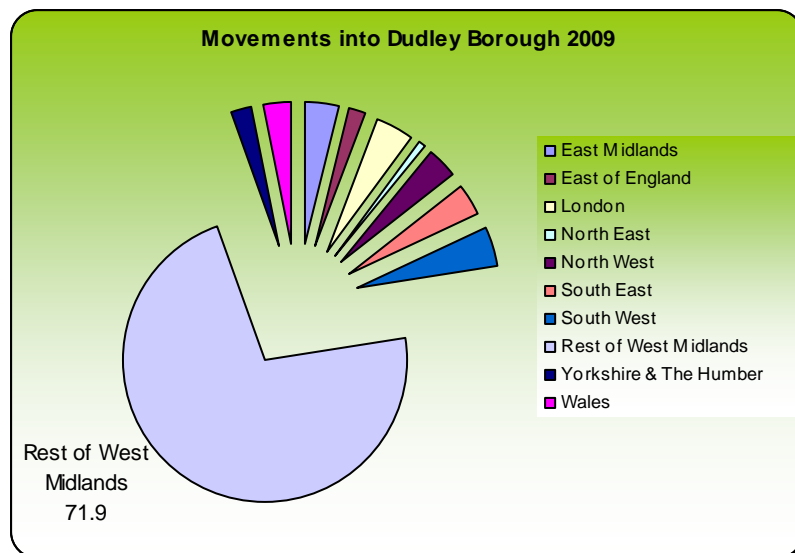
¹ The A8 nations, are the former Eastern European countries that acceded to the EU in 2004 : Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Czech republic, Slovakia, Hungary and Slovenia.

Internal Migration

- Overall, flows into the Borough did not change significantly between 2002 and 2009. In 2009, 71.9% of internal migration into Dudley Borough came from the West Midlands compared with 73.8% in 2002. The second highest proportion of in-flows came from London with 4.1% in 2009 followed by the East Midlands with 4.0% and the South East with 3.7%.

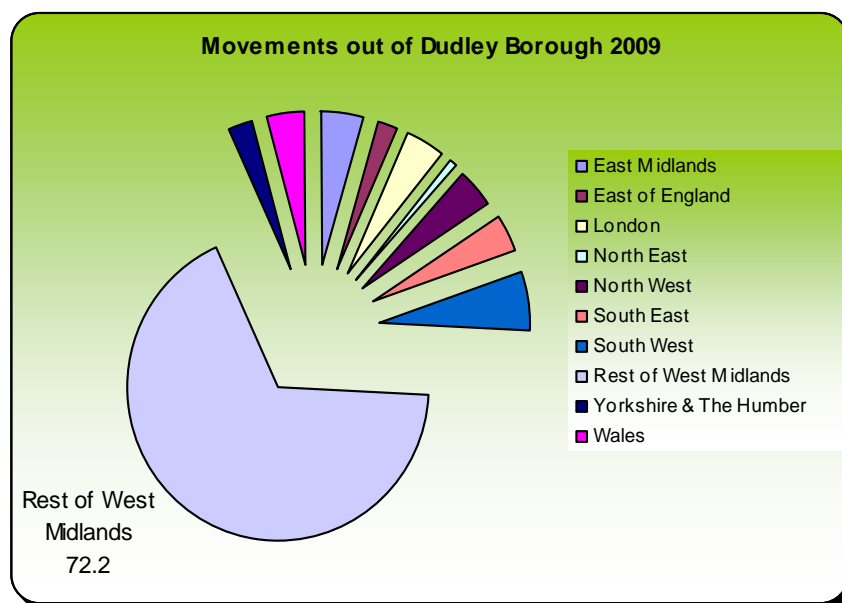

- As with inward flows, the rate of flows out of the Borough did not change significantly between 2002 and 2009. The rate of people moving out of the Borough to other parts of the West Midlands was almost identical to the rate of those moving in. The second highest proportion of out-flows in 2009 was to the East Midlands (4.8%) followed jointly by London and Wales (4.4%).

Population Projections

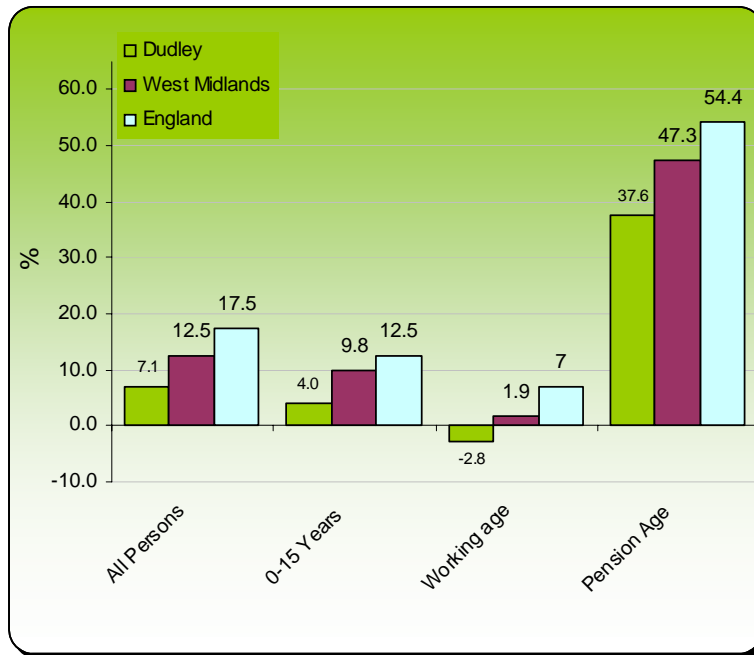
- By 2033, the population of Dudley Borough is projected to increase to 328,900, a percentage change of 7.1% from 2009. This projected increase is the lowest of the Black Country authorities and significantly lower than regional and national projections.
- The Borough's working age population is projected to decrease gradually to 177,900 by 2033, an overall decrease of 2.8% compared with a 1.9% increase across the West Midlands region and a 7% increase nationally.
- By 2033, people of pension age will account for 27.6% of the Borough's population compared with 21.5% in 2009. The population of older people is projected to increase by 37.6% by 2033.

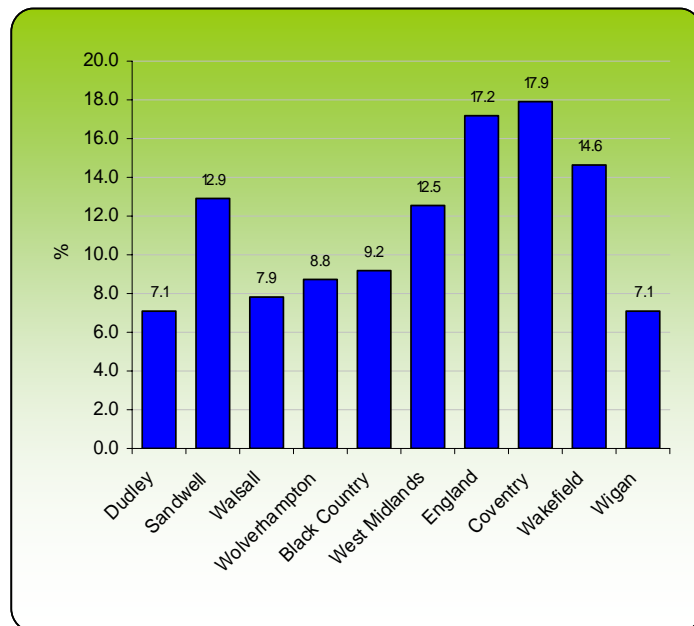
